

CHILDREN IN COMMUNITY CARE (CCC) PROGRAM

EMPOWERING YOUTH WITH COMPLEX NEEDS TO THRIVE IN COMMUNITY SETTINGS

Program Overview: The Children in Community Care (CCC) Program provides a continuum of care for youth and young adults who have mental health diagnoses such as Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities (DDID). These individuals are often in the custody of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services or under single case agreements with Medicaid. The CCC Program offers intensive, therapeutic placement options in specialized group homes in residential neighborhoods, promoting community integration and independence.

WHO WE SERVE:

Youth in state custody or under Medicaid agreements, between the ages of 10-21 with ASD, DDID, and other complex mental health needs.



Youth who are in need of 24-hour staff supervision due to challenges in the home that places the safety of the youth or others at risk.

- Seven specialized group homes licensed as 3-4 bed residential treatment facilities
- Multidisciplinary teams including therapists, behavior analysts, case managers, and youth care workers
- Individualized care plans focusing on therapeutic support, life skills development, and community engagement
